

Like a mountain range, Ecclesiastes is filled with both peaks and valleys. Under the sun, life is vanity, temporary, "poof" (hevel). It's like chasing after the wind. In the fear of God, life is worth living. We've seen valleys of unfairness, our inability to control our lives, and the limits of wisdom. But the ultimate conclusion of this book is glorious. It takes us to the summit, where the view is clear and the lesson is life-changing: Center your life in the fear of God.
