

Context of the Book

- Why were the Jews even in Persia?
 - Ahasuerus- most historians agree that this is Xerxes (1:1-2)
 - Xerxes was the grandson of <u>Cyrus</u>
 - He is called God's <u>shepherd</u> and <u>anointed</u> (Isaiah 42:24-45:1)
 - Xerxes allowed Israel to go back home (2 Chron. 36:22-23; Ezra 1:1-4; Ezra 6:3-5)
 - If Xerxes allowed Israel to return home, why were many Jews_still there?!?!
 - It is possible that many preferred to live in a <u>secular</u> culture.
- God is never mentioned in this book.
 - The author wants us to realize that God is working <u>behind</u> the scenes.
 - The author wants us to realize that the characters had almost completely <u>abandoned</u> God in their thinking and their lifestyle.

When God is <u>abandoned</u>, life becomes <u>confusing</u>.

Moral confusion!

- The presence of Jews in Persia
- Vasthi's refusal of the King Xerxes' Request (1:10-12)
- Esther's willingness to join the contest for queen (2:8)
- Mordecai's command to hide Esther's nationality (2:10)
- Esther's sexual audition with King Xerxes (2:15-17)
- Mordecai's choice not to bow to Haman (3:1-4)
- Mordecai's mourning (4:1-3)

- Mordecai's <u>conversation</u> with Esther (4:4-17)
- Israel's mourning (4:15-17)
- Esther entering the King's throne-room (6:14-7:6)
- Slaughter of many non-Jews (9:11-19)

God is Sovereign in the Shadows (Esther 4:4-17)

- When studying the Bible, remember that we are trying to understand what message the <u>author</u> is trying to get across.
- He included all of these confusing moral situations, so what is he really trying to get across to us?
 - "And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?"
 - Even when God's people <u>abandon</u> Him, He is still sovereignly working in the shadows for his glory and their good.

When life becomes confusing, God is still sovereignly working in the shadows.

God is Sovereign in the Shadows

- God is in control despite our failures
 - We fail in our <u>pride</u>
 - We fail sexually
 - We fail to trust God
 - We fail to be <u>Godly</u>
- God is in control despite our enemies
- God is in control despite our circumstances

Because God is still sovereignly working in the shadows, we should acknowledge Him in every step of our lives.
