Lesson 14:

Think Before You Speak: A Lesson on Speech¹

Put on Constructive Speech.

- Constructive speech builds up others.
 - o By revealing a pure heart (Prov. 10:20, 15:26, 16:23).
 - o By providing spiritual life (Prov. 10:11; 15:4).
 - o By giving wisdom to others (Prov. 10:21, 31, 15:7, 18:4).
- Constructive speech is helpful.
 - o It encourages (Prov. 12:18, 25; 16:24).
 - o It promotes peace (Prov. 15:1).
 - o It teaches (Prov. 16:21).
 - o It is patiently persuasive (25:15).
 - O It produces joy (Prov. 15:23; 25:11).
- Constructive speech is rewarding.
 - o Bringing respect from others (Prov. 16:13; 24:26).
 - o Bringing personal satisfaction (Prov. 12:14; 13:2; 18:20).
- Constructive speech is God-given (Prov. 16:1, 10).

Put on Controlled Speech.

- The wise can control His tongue.
 - o He knows what to say (Prov. 10:32).
 - He knows how to say it (Prov. 15:2, 28).
 - He knows when to shut up (Prov. II:12; 12:23; 17:28; 29:II).
 - He stays out of trouble (Prov. 13:3; 14:3; 21:23).
- Tips to controlling your tongue.
 - O Don't speak prematurely (Prov. 18:13; 29:20).
 - o Don't speak too frequently (Prov. 10:19; 14:23; 17:27).
 - o Don't speak inappropriately.

- Boasting (Prov. 20:6; 25:14; 27:1-2)
- Critical (Prov. 25:23; 30:10)
- Thoughtless (Prov. 27:14)
- Impersonal (Prov. 25:9-10)

Put on Correct Speech.

- Truthful speech is a <u>command</u> from God (Prov. 3:3-4; 6:16-19; 12:22).
- Truthful speech is a spiritual indicator (Prov. 10:18; 12:17; 13:5; 14; 5, 25).
- Truthful speech is deeply <u>impactful</u> (Prov. 19:22; 21:6; 25:18; 29:12).
- Truthful speech will win in the end (Prov. 12:19; 19:5, 9; 22:28)
- Truthful speech is a willful choice (Prov. 24:28; 30:8-9).

Put off Corrupt Speech.

- Corrupt speech is incredibly destructive (Prov. 12:6; 16:27; 18:21).
- Gossip destroys relationships.
 - o It ruins friendships (Prov. 16:28; 17:9).
 - o It causes strife (Prov. 26:20).
 - o It betrays confidence (Prov. 11:13; 20:19).
 - o It wounds deeply (Prov. 18:8; 26:22).
- Flattery fools the gullible (Prov.2:16, 18; 6:24; 7:21; 29:5, 28).
- Hypocrites speak to <u>destroy</u> others (Prov. II:9, 26:23-25).
- Perverse speech is (1) hated by God (Prov. 8:13) and (2) hurts the speaker (Prov. 17:20).
- Put off corrupt speech (Prov. 4:24; 19:1).
