Lesson 6:

Discipling through Encouragement (Acts 4:36-37)

What is Christian encouragement?

- Encouragement comes through <u>exhortation</u> (parakaleo).
 - o To call someone alongside (Acts 28:20)
 - o To call someone to action (2 Cor. 10:1; Heb. 3:13)
 - o To make an urgent request (Matt. 8:5-6).
 - o To give comfort or cheer (2 Cor. 1:6; 13:11)
 - o To be inviting or welcoming with a kind spirit (1 Tim. 5:1).
- Encouragement comes through edification (oikodome).
 - o An actual building project (Mark 13:1; 1 Cor. 3:9).
 - A spiritual <u>building-up</u>, growth, or advancement (Rom. 14:19; 15:2; 1 Cor. 14:5)

Christians encourage each other from personal <u>counseling</u> and strategic upbuilding.

Who displayed encouragement?

- The Life of Barnabas.
 - o Barnabas' Introduction: "Son of encouragement" (Acts 4:36-37).
 - o Barnabas stands up for Paul (Acts 9:26-31).
 - o Barnabas is called to preach to the Gentiles (Acts 11:19-30).
 - o Barnabas and Paul are sent as <u>travelling</u> missionaries (Acts 13:1-12).
 - o They returned and reported on their travels (Acts 15:30-35).



- o Barnabas and Paul split over John Mark (Acts 15:36-41).
- They also worked together to defend the new Gentile believers (Gal. 2:1-13).
- Tychichus: His goal was to (1) know how they were doing and (2) comfort their hearts (Eph. 6:21-22; Col. 4:7-9)
- Timothy and <u>Titus</u>:
 - o Timothy needed to exhort with <u>patience</u> and truth (2 Tim. 4:2).
 - o Titus needed to exhort with <u>authority</u> (Titus 2:15).
- Philemon: A man of comfort and refreshment (Philemon 7)

How can you become a better encourager?

- Put yourself in the <u>position</u> to be an encouragement (2 Cor. 13:11; Col. 2:1-2
 - o Build consistent bridges of <u>friendship</u>.
 - o Make yourself available and <u>vulnerable</u> to people.
- Encouragers sometimes risk their reputation for their disciples (Acts 9:26-31; 15:36-41).
- Have a Christ-like care for others (Eph. 5:1-2).
- Encouragers need to grow in encouraging <u>themselves</u> in order to give others <u>hope</u> (2 Cor. 1).
- Encouragers must give something <u>substantive</u> and helpful (Rom. 15:2; 2 Cor. 13:10).
- In order to build up, you have to tell the truth (Gal. 6:1-2).
- Encouragers disciple more encouragers (Acts 9:27, 31).
