Matthew 16:21-28

I. Realize how real disciples think (vs. 21-23)

A. Real disciples think about the Messiah's mission.

dei- it is necessary

- The Messiah must go to Jerusalem.
- The Messiah must suffer (John 20:28, 26:28).
- The Messiah must die.
- The Messiah must <u>rise</u>.
- B. Real disciples think about the Messiah's message.
 - Peter took Jesus aside (v. 22a).
 - Peter <u>rebuked</u> Jesus (v. 22ab).—Far be it from you Lord!
 - Jesus turned to Peter (v. 23).
 - Jesus <u>rebuked</u> Peter (v. 23).

A real disciple of Jesus Christ is God-minded!

II. Realize how real disciples <u>live</u> (v. 24).

- A. Real disciples live with self-denial. —let him deny himself
 - Our natural tendency is to <u>love</u> self!
 - Our example of self-denial is Jesus (Phi. 2:3-11)



- True self-denial is putting God and His kingdom first!
- B. Real disciples live with self-sacrifice. —and take up his cross
 - True discipleship is a life of potential martyrdom.
 - True discipleship is willing to sacrifice daily.
- C. Real disciples live with self-<u>commitment</u>. —and follow me "There is no crossless obedience to Christ!—John MacArthur

III. Realize how real disciples evaluate life (vs. 25-28)

- A. Real disciples realize that <u>earthly</u> things don't matter.

 Those who pursue themselves will <u>lose</u> themselves.
- B. Real disciples realize that <u>heavenly</u> things do matter.

 My greatest need is not my <u>happiness</u>; my greatest need is <u>God!</u>
